B. Curriculum development work:

Goals and Objectives of a Pediatric Rheumatology Elective for Medical Students and Residents 1987 – 1988

This is a three page set of goals and objectives which I wrote as Chairman of the Education Committee of the Affiliated Children's Arthritis Centers of New England. It is given to students and residents who take the elective in pediatric rheumatology with me at Baylor College of Medicine.

Core Lectures in Pediatric Rheumatology 1989 – 2004

This is a set of interactive presentations which I proposed, developed, delivered and regularly updated for pediatric residents at various programs.

Core Lectures in Pediatric Rheumatology 1989 – 2001

This is a set of interactive presentations which I proposed, developed, delivered and regularly updated for orthopedic residents.

Pediatric Handbook for Medical Students 1989 – 1990

This is a 242 page reference which I wrote to replace the Pediatric Core Course Syllabus. The Handbook was given to all students at the beginning of the core pediatric rotation through 1995.

Video Screen Program 1990

This was a program which I produced with Ms. Louise Deretchin of the Computing Resource Center at Baylor College of Medicine. The program was presented to the Department of Pediatrics at Grand Rounds with the use of a computer driven video projector. This was one of the first uses of this technology at Baylor.

Medical Student Educational Objectives for the Core Rotation in Pediatrics 1991 –1993

This is a 13 page set of educational goals and objectives which I wrote with input from a committee of faculty, residents, and students. It forms the basis of the set which was given to all medical students.

Evaluation of Lectures in the Core Pediatric Rotation 1992

This was a program which I proposed, organized and directed. I developed an evaluation form which was used by students and members of the Curriculum Committee, Department of Pediatrics, to assess the lectures given during the core pediatric rotation. Feedback was provided to all lecturers.

Teaching Residents to Teach Workshop 1992

This was a one day workshop for Baylor residents which I proposed, organized and helped to present at the Wyndham Warwick Hotel in Houston, TX. Twenty residents from sixteen residency programs participated.

Introduction to Teaching Skills 1993

This was a half-day workshop for pediatric residents at Driscoll Foundation Children's Hospital in Corpus Christi, TX which I proposed, developed and delivered. Twenty-four residents participated.

Report with Recommendation for Resident Teaching 1993

This is a report which I wrote and submitted to the Committee on Graduate Medical Education. My goal was to stimulate the development of programs which would provide instruction on teaching to all residents at Baylor.

Teaching Residents to Teach Workshop 1993

This was a one-day workshop for Baylor residents which I proposed, organized and helped to present at the Wyndham Warwick Hotel in Houston, TX. Thirty-four residents from sixteen residency programs participated.

Recommendations on Clinical Teaching Strategies 1993

This is a report written by John Rogers, M.D. and myself based on work done in a Task Force which we co-chaired. It was submitted to Baylor's Curriculum Committee during Phase I of the curriculum revision and its contents were used in developing Phase II of the curriculum revision.

Introduction to Teaching Skills 1994

This was the second part of the program I had instituted the previous year for pediatric residents at the Driscoll Children's Hospital. Twenty-five residents participated.

Report of the New Courses Task Force 1994

This is a report which I wrote following discussions with other members of the task force and which was submitted to Baylor's Curriculum Committee during Phase II of the curriculum revision. Its contents were used in developing Phase III of curriculum revision.

Leading Small Group Discussions 1994

This is a two-hour workshop and manual developed by Dr. Martin Lorin and myself and given to faculty in the Department of Pediatrics.

Stanford Faculty Development Program 1994 – 2003

This is a series of seven workshops each of which deals with a different aspect of clinical teaching. Each workshop lasts approximately 3 hours and consists of a brief lecture, videotape analysis and role-playing. The program has been presented to Key Clinical Faculty of the Hartford Initiative to Improve Geriatrics Training for Primary Care Residents, to selected faculty from Baylor at large, and was part of the curriculum of the Master Teachers' Fellowship Program.

Recommendations for Medical Educator 1994

This is a report and recommendation which I wrote as Chairman of the Committee for Faculty Training and Development and submitted to Baylor's Curriculum Committee. We recommended that Baylor hire a full-time medical educator.

Report and Recommendation:

Resident Teaching Program 1995

This is a report with recommendations which I wrote with the help of the Committee for Faculty Training and Education. The report outlined specific steps which would provide teaching training for all residents at Baylor, and was submitted to the Curriculum Committee.

Workshop for Mentors 1995

This is a two and one half hour workshop which I developed and presented to the mentors of the new course in the Baylor Curriculum entitled Patient, Physician, and Society as part of their development as course faculty. This workshop was part of phase III of the curriculum revision.

Workshop for Preceptors 1995

This is a one-hour workshop which I developed and presented to the preceptors of the new Baylor course entitled Patient, Physician, and Society as part of their development as course faculty. It was part of phase III of the curriculum revision.

Report and Recommendations on Facilitator Development 1995

This is a report I wrote following discussion with the Committee for Faculty Training and Education which outlines methods for training members of the Baylor faculty to become facilitators in the new Baylor course entitled Integrative Problem Solving. It was part of phase III of the curriculum revision.

Master Teachers' Fellowship Program 1995 – 2003

This is a program which I devised and developed with the advice of the Committee for Faculty Training and Education. Its goal was to develop an elite group of medical educators within Baylor's faculty through a part time, fifteen-month experience composed of didactic workshops, interactive discussion groups and independent research and development projects. This program was developed as part of phase III of the curriculum revision, and was specifically cited by the L.C.M.E. in its assessments in 1998 as an important asset of Baylor College of Medicine.

Resident Teaching Program 1996

This is a program which I devised and developed, and which I implemented in association with Joan Friedland, M.D., M.P.H. Its goal was to provide, using a dissemination model, physicians in graduate training at Baylor with formal instruction in how to teach. Thirteen of seventeen residency programs at Baylor participated in the program.

Report and Recommendations: Teacher Evaluation Forms 1996

This is a report which I wrote and delivered with Teacher Evaluation Forms which had been developed by the Committee for Faculty Training and Education. This work was done as part of phase III of the curriculum revision.

Report on the Teacher's Portfolio 1996

This is a report and an outline which I developed and wrote with input from the Committee for Faculty Training and Education. It is for the organization and presentation of activities related to teaching and for use by members of the Baylor faculty to help improve their teaching and to document their various educational endeavors for promotional purposes.

Report for the Department of Orthopedics 1996

This is a report with recommendations which I wrote for the Department of Orthopedics, Baylor College of Medicine after having been asked to help improve education within that department, and after meeting with representatives of the faculty and residency program.

Pediatrics 101 1997
